Downtown London receives Government of Canada support through My Main Street Community Activator Placemaking Program

July 13th, 2022 – London, ON – The Downtown London BIA is pleased to announce that our Richmond Row Concert Series was selected for the <u>My Main Street Community Activator</u> program and has received \$14,496 to add vibrancy to the core and strengthen our city's UNESCO City of Music designation.

Through the Government of Canada's My Main Street Community Activator, delivered by the <u>Canadian Urban Institute</u> (CUI), Downtown London will enjoy a more vibrant neighbourhood setting that will draw visitors and increase foot traffic to shops, restaurants and exciting new public spaces. The Downtown London BIA is supported by My Main Street—a two-year, \$23.25-million investment by the Government of Canada through the <u>Federal Economic Development</u> Agency for Southern Ontario (FedDev Ontario), delivered by CUI and the <u>Economic Development</u> Council of Ontario (EDCO).

The Richmond Row Concert Series is a program of free, accessible, outdoor street performances by local London musicians rotating at key Richmond Street intersections of Piccadilly, Albert, and Mill every Thursday, Friday, and Saturday. This is a collaboration between Downtown London, the London Arts Council, the City of London, and Dundas Place. The Richmond Row concert series adds onto the ambience of the city core, benefits surrounding Richmond Row businesses by increasing foot traffic, and contributes to the music scene in London, further enhancing programs to elevate the UNESCO City of Music designation.

By putting on a consistent schedule of musical performances, the Richmond Row Concert Series enhances the foot traffic driven into the downtown core, and encourages the program attendees to visit various local locations, enjoy a meal from a local business during the musical performance, and to keep on exploring the downtown core. By incentivizing the neighbouring businesses to the street performances, it has encouraged them to participate and help promote the program while also bringing people into their store and surrounding businesses.

Since the program began in June, the Richmond Row Concert Series has drawn over 250 event-goers into the city core, and has generated an average weekly social media reach of 3000 accounts. This program has been able to champion and support 43 unique and local musicians giving them an opportunity to showcase their talent to the streets of London. This further supports London's musical culture and UNESCO City of Music title, and can only help it grow from here.
